Criterion 4.1. Faculty Qualifications. The program shall have a clearly defined faculty which, by virtue of its distribution, multidisciplinary nature, educational preparation, practice experience and research and instructional competence, is able to fully support the program's mission, goals and objectives.

In order to show that this criterion is met, annual data is collected for all CEOMPH faculty including:

- Name
- Title/Academic rank
- FTE or percent time to the CEOMPH Program
- Graduate degrees earned
- Discipline in which those degrees were earned
- Institutions from which those degrees were earned
- Current instructional areas
- Current research interest

Additionally, the following is reported to CEPH

- Primary faculty who support the degree program
- Summary data on the qualifications of other program faculty (adjunct, part-time, secondary appointments, etc.)
- Description of the manner in which the faculty complement integrates perspectives from the field of practice
- Identification of measurable objectives by which the program assesses the qualifications of its faculty
