

3.2 Service. The program shall pursue active service activities, consistent with its mission, through which faculty and students contribute to the advancement of public health practice.

a. Description of the program's service activities, including policies, procedures and practices that support service. If the program has formal contracts or agreements with external agencies, these should be noted.

The mission statement specifically mentions service to improve the health of communities. So, it follows that CEOMPH is committed to community service in order to improve public health outcomes in partnership with others. This commitment, which has been evident since the inception of the program, is evidenced in several components.

CEOMPH faculty are involved in collaborative activities with many community agencies. Service also involves committee participation, professional association involvement and leadership and academic collaborations. For example, staff in the MPH office are involved in Portage County Community Health Improvement Planning efforts. Criterion 3.2.c. illustrates that many of our faculty are also involved in national and regional associations and professional service. Faculty share opportunities with each other on public health meetings that might involve the help of students.

The program itself does not have formal contracts with external agencies except for the agreements with community preceptor sites for the student projects. Twelve agency and many individual preceptor agreements on file, which are required for all Capstone Projects and Public Health Practice and Issues sites.

b. Description of the emphasis given to community and professional service activities in the promotion and tenure process.

Program faculty members are not only committed to teaching the importance of service through lectures and discussions, but they also model a commitment to service through their own professional and voluntary community activities.

A full listing of the service activities that the program's teaching faculty have been engaged in over the last three years is included in Electronic resource file 3.2.b. The activities have been broken out into four main categories: professional positions, including paid, community-based positions held by faculty members; community consulting, including consulting or advising on specific projects as well as local, regional or national committee memberships; review activity including both formal grant review service as well as scholarly publication reviews; and FTE or % time spent on all service activities.

The program supports and encourages student service activities. In the first year, student participation in professional associations is encouraged. CEOMPH purchases the first year Ohio Public Health Association membership for all students. Students have become a Governing Council members, committee members, and conference planners for the Ohio Public Health Association. In the Public Health Concepts course a list of all associations that students are involved in is developed as well to illustrate the importance of professional associations. Students are encouraged to log their service activities and include service on their resumes or CVs.

Since many of the CEOMPH students are working professionals, many tend to be engaged in various community service projects as a part of their job. Program alumni, faculty and students send the program service opportunity announcements. When service opportunities become available, they are emailed to MPH constituents for consideration. For example, recently, one student working with Ohio Public Health Association sent out a survey on their behalf to find out how to improve their website.

The program also encourages service during Public Health Week, although activities extend through all of April. Because each of the university areas are associated with a local food bank, canned food collections and volunteering at the food bank are organized activities. a. Assessment of the extent to which this criterion is met and an analysis of the program's strengths, weaknesses and plans relating to this criterion.

This criterion is met. CEOMPH faculty and students perform service activities associated and not associated with course work.

Strengths: The program sponsors service activities and encourages students to engage in service. Faculty serve on many professional associations and are reviewers and are engaged in funded and unfunded service. In addition, many faculty serve on community committees. The program pays for first year student membership in the Ohio Public Health Association.

Weaknesses: The program cannot dictate that faculty belonging to other universities to service. However, service is an important component of being faculty. Also, it is difficult for the program to track faculty and student service.

Plan: The program will sponsor events and encourage service among faculty and students in professional associations and the community.
